REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SUBMITTED TEXT AND THE MANNER OF ITS EDITING

The editors of "Studies in Theological Sciences" accept only texts not yet published in paper or online.

The texts should be on theology, biblical sciences, Christian philosophy, canon law, church history or religious studies, and related disciplines relevant to theological research.

We accept texts in Polish and in English, German, Italian, or Spanish.

Texts (including footnotes) should not exceed 45 thousand characters (with spaces). The text should be saved in OpenOffice, Microsoft Word or RTF format. Page margins should be 2.5 cm. Throughout the text, please use Times New Roman 12 pt font, spacing 1.5.

Please do not separate quotes in the text by using a different typeface or changing the width of the column.

When the author intends to highlight a word or phrase in the text, please use italics, not underlining (except for website addresses).

Passages omitted from quotations should be marked with three dots in square brackets: [...].

The author should take care to obtain permission to use copyrighted materials in the article, such as photographs or reproductions of works of art, and should inform the Editor.

For each scientific article, you should prepare:

- abstract and list of key words (see RULES FOR REDACTING THE ABSTRACT AND KEYWORDS);
- appendix bibliography (see RULES FOR REDACTING THE BIBLIOGRAPHY APPENDIX BIBLIOGRAPHY);
- a short biographical note (see RULES FOR REDACTING A BIROGRAPHICAL NOTE BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE).

Please do not attach the above metadata to the article text, but enter it separately according to the instructions after logging in to the journal website.

Instead, at the end of the text of the article, there should be a list of abbreviations used by the author in the text or footnotes.

In order to ensure the process of anonymous review (double blind review), please do not include the author's name and affiliation in the article heading, and remove from the text any reference that would identify the author.

Submitted works will undergo a review procedure (see https://journals.pan.pl/snt → REVIEW PROCEDURE). The author will be immediately informed of its outcome, the content of the submitted reviews, as well as the Editor's decision regarding publication.

Prior to publication, the author should send to the Editorial Board a scan of the agreement signed by him/her, in which he/she grants the Publisher of "Studies in Theological Sciences" a non-exclusive and royalty-free license to use the work. The above guidelines do not apply to texts that are not scientific articles, placed in the REVIEWS AND REVIEWS block. They do not require metadata and are not subject to the review procedure, and their admission or rejection is decided by the Editors.
